Dr. Martin Siegert, Professor of Geosciences in the department of Earth Sciences and Engineering, Imperial College London, has postulated that the current atmospheric conditions of Earth are much like the Pliocene epoch which spanned from 5.3 to 2.6 million years ago. Sedimentary records and plant fossils recently found in Antarctica near the South Pole revealed evidence that the temperatures then were 20c higher than today and global sea levels were 15 to 20 metres higher. Volcanism is the most popular theory which caused the rise in carbon dioxide in the atmosphere at that time which matches the same levels of greenhouse gasses currently measured in our atmosphere today. The global temperature in the Pliocene epoch has been calculated to be about 3 to 4 degrees Celsius warmer and since the industrial revolution, the global temperature of Earth has already risen by 1 degree Celsius.

"If you put your oven on at home and set it to 200C the temperature does not get to that immediately, it takes a bit of time, and it is the same with climate," Siegert said, at a Royal Meteorological Society meeting on the climate of the Pliocene.
